

MFAT Management Response to Evaluation of the Pacific Fisheries Training Programme.



Evaluation: This was an end-of-programme evaluation covering March 2013 to

December 2017. Three stakeholder case studies were investigated:

private industry

• public sector and

• community.

The findings will be used by MFAT and stakeholders to assess programme

effectiveness and relevance, and to inform decisions about a second

phase of PFTP.

Background: The Pacific Fisheries Training Programme (PFTP) was introduced to ensure

a greater contribution from the seafood sector in the Pacific. To achieve

this, over 700 men and women were trained in fisheries including business development and seafood safety and handling. Training took place in-country, regionally and, through scholarships, in New Zealand.
