

Management Response:

Review of the SPC (Pacific Community)-MFAT core funding partnership

Allen and Clarke were commissioned by MFAT to undertake a mid-term review of the SPC - MFAT Core Funding Partnership, the current phase of which is \$45 million over five years (2020-2024) for membership fees and programme funding.

The review, which was co-governed with SPC, assessed the extent to which MFAT's funding and partnership model enables or constrains SPC's performance and delivery; and to identify any improvements both for the final 24 months of funding under the current partnership or for the next funding phase from 2025.

The review found evidence of a mature, open, constructive relationship. The strong values and trust-based model, and New Zealand's flexible funding, aligned with member priorities; and enabled SPC to focus and deliver on its core work programme. The review concluded the relationship and funding approach was a model that other donors might follow.

Partially agree – MFAT nor SPC are currently intending to do a final evaluation of the current funding phase. We will use opportunities at SPC governance meetings and informally to gain country member perspectives on the partnership, including how it enables national priorties.

7	The flexibility of the funding enables SPC to be responsive, is highly valued and effective, and should continue to be a feature of future core funding partnerships.	Agree – look to continue this as a feature of future core funding phases.
8	Ensure focal points are supported to continue to manage and maintain the relationship. This requires commitment from MFAT and SPC to support focal points who are engaged, can access senior levels of MFAT or SPC, can maintain communication and trust, and can articulate the value of the relationship to other stakeholders.
