About the ASEAN-CER Integration Partnership Forum


The ASEAN-CER Integration Partnership Forum (IPF) was launched in 2011 to complement the implementation process of the ASEAN Australia New Zealand Free Trade Agreement (AANZFTA).

The IPF was designed to share the experiences and ‘lessons learned’ of New Zealand, Australia and ASEAN in working towards regional economic integration in different settings. The Forum’s setting is deliberately informal and non-binding, drawing on ‘lessons learned’ and perspectives not just from officials but also business, academics, technical experts and other thought-leaders from the region.

The IPF meetings that have been held since 2011 have spanned many different aspects of regional economic integration, from governance models to the specifics of services trade, competition policy, agri-food trade, standards in goods trade, good regulatory practices and digital trade.

Trade and sustainable development



VIEWING EXPERIENCE

- For the best viewing experience, join the broadcast via the Zoom link on the desktop or mobile application of Zoom on your computer OR phone, and not the web browser interface. **Please ensure you have an up-to-date version of Zoom.** You can check for available updates by:
- Signing in to Zoom desktop client.
- Clicking on your profile picture (Top right) then clicking on “Check for Updates”.
- This is the same for Windows and Mac

DISPLAY NAMES

Ideally you would dial in to Zoom using a laptop or iPad. If you use an iPhone or other phone, please ensure you are set to landscape mode (phone on its side). If you are presenting or asked to speak, please have your camera on and please unmute yourself just before you start speaking and then mute yourself when your presentation is finished. This is so our technical team can see if you are there and ready to present, and so we can spotlight you to speak.

Please ensure that you have a stable internet connection for the event. We recommend using a hardwired connection where possible. If this is not possible, please set up your laptop or phone near your Wi-Fi router.

FOR PRESENTERS

Because we are showcasing you on our screen, follow the set up instructions listed below to ensure your camera feed is set up correctly.

Camera Angle

Where you are looking in the camera matters. You want to make your audience feel like you are talking to them, not reading off your notes. Place yourself in the middle of the video with the webcam at eye level. If you are using your computer, achieve the appropriate height by stacking books under your laptop or using a computer stand.

Lighting

Ensure you are connecting from a light space with the lighting source e.g window in front of you, not behind you which will cause a silhouette. Please make sure all of the lights are on in the room you are connecting from. If the room is dark, move a lamp in front of your computer.

Self-Presentation

What you wear matters. Avoid patterns like stripes, polka dots, and logos that can cause distractions on camera. Pick colours that contrast with your background.

Sound

Test that your mic is working and make sure there is no background noise such as traffic, music or office sounds where you are presenting from.

Internet

Ensure others in your household are not using the internet for streaming while you are participating in the broadcast e.g Netflix / YouTube / FaceTime calls etc. As this can utilise your bandwidth and make your picture and audio distorted.
