**Briefing Addendum**: Planning for 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Independence and the Samoa-New Zealand Treaty of Friendship

# Summary

The outbreak of COVID-19 in Samoa has impacted the nation's plans for its 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary events to mark independence on 1 June and the signing of the Samoa-New Zealand Treaty of Friendship on 1 August. The Government of Samoa is still considering which anniversary events might be possible, and we continue to plan for high-level commemoration in the New Zealand system – including by leveraging the visit of Samoa Prime Minister, Fiame Naomi Mata'afa, in June.

### Samoa's Planning

# Independence

- Samoa is considering delaying Independence Day celebrations from June to September to coincide with Teuila festivities. (Established in 1991, Samoa's Teuila Festival showcases Samoa's culture for a week each year)
- A church service to mark Independence is being planned for December.

Treaty of Friendship

Yet to be confirmed, but Samoa hopes to do something to mark the occasion.

# Suggested Action

Minister Sio might take the opportunity to ask what the Minister knows of plans to mark the anniversaries, noting New Zealand's own plans (as below) and keenness to participate – hopefully through attendance by New Zealand VIPs s9(2)(f)(iv)

# Aotearoa New Zealand's Planning

Given Samoa's COVID-19 outbreak, our plans for engagement in Samoa's commemorations are tentative. However, we have more certainty as to what might be possible in New Zealand, particularly with growing assurances that Prime Minister Fiame will be able to visit Aotearoa New Zealand in June.

# Independence

- In early March, the New Zealand High Commissioner to Samoa, Dr. Trevor Matheson, hosted a reception to commemorate the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of diplomatic relations with guests that included Samoa's Head of State and Prime Minister.
- With high level visits looking unlikely in the immediate term, we are looking at virtual activities until travel becomes possible. For example, we are investigating with Government House whether the Governor General would provide a virtual message to the Government and people of Samoa to contribute to whatever smallscale events the Government of Samoa is able to undertake in Samoa.

### Treaty of Friendship

- New Zealand launched the 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary logo with Government of Samoa.
- The High Commission in Apia is considering small-scale activity to mark Independence and the Treaty of Friendship, such as social media campaigns and competitions which commemorate the relationship.
- Prime Minister Fiame Naomi Mata'afa looks quite firm to visit Wellington in mid-June. s9(2)(f)(iv)

Prime Minister Ardern,

<sup>s9(2)(f)(iv)</sup> Foreign Minister Mahuta and yourself will be key to the visit's success. A diaspora event, probably in Auckland, is also anticipated.

 The High Commission in Apia is looking at options for hosting a monthly meeting of the Samoa Chamber of Commerce, starting in the second half of the year, s9(2)(g)(i)

# Suggested Action
