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I refer to your OIA request, partially transferred to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade by the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet on 19 May 2022, in which you request the following under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA):

I ask for all documents relating to New Zealand's relationship, conversations or agreements with the World Economic Forum

On 26 May 2022, we wrote to advise you that responding to your request as currently framed would require review of a significant amount of information. Accordingly, we asked you to refine your request.

You replied on 26 May 2022, refining your request to be the following:

I am particularly interested in New Zealand's agreements and obligations to the World Economic Forum.

a) New Zealand is designated as the depository of the WEF's Digital Economy Partnership Agreement.

b) New Zealand has the role of pilot project for the WEF Reimaging Regulations for the Age of AI.

c) I am interested in NZ/*Aotearoa's commitment to the World Economic Forum's reset agenda.*

I ask for all documents relating to New Zealand's relationship, conversations or agreements with the World Economic Forum about the above matters.

With respect to the three elements of your refined request above, we advise:

a) The World Economic Forum (WEF) has no relationship to the Digital Economy Partnership Agreement, which is an agreement between New Zealand, Chile and Singapore. Accordingly, this part of your request is refused under section 18(e) of the OIA, as the information you have requested does not exist.

b) All documents relating to New Zealand's relationship, conversations or agreements with the World Economic Forum about New Zealand's role in the WEF Reimaging Regulations for the Age of AI pilot project, is more closely connected with the functions of the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) (section 14(b)(ii) of the OIA refers). In these circumstances, we are required by section 14 of the Official Information Act to transfer your request. Accordingly, on 1 June 2022 we advised you that we had transferred part b) of your request to MBIE. You will hear further from MBIE concerning that part of your request.

c) The information relevant to this part of your request is attached. We have withheld some information under section 6(b)(ii) of the OIA, to protect the passing of information from an international organisation on a confidential basis.

THE GREAT RESET

An unprecedented new global context

The Covid-19 crisis, and the political, economic and social disruptions it has caused, is fundamentally changing the traditional context for decision-making. The inconsistencies, inadequacies and contradictions of multiple systems – from health and financial to energy and education – are more exposed than ever amidst a global context of concern for lives, livelihoods and the planet. We want to seize this opportunity, and for this reason are starting **The Great Reset**. As we enter a unique window of opportunity to shape the recovery, this initiative will provide the guidance needed to help determine the future state of global relations, the direction of national economies, the priorities of societies, the nature of business models and the management of our global commons. Drawing from the vision and vast expertise of the leaders engaged across the Forum's communities, the Great Reset initiative will have the following dimensions:

- Shaping the global economic recovery and a new trajectory of growth
- Redesigning social contracts, skills and jobs for the economy of tomorrow
- Restoring the health of our global commons through the SDGs and the Paris Climate Agreement
- Developing successful, sustainable and resilient business models
- Promoting global cooperation and revitalizing the multilateral system
- Strengthening regional development and cooperation

The Great Reset Dialogues

In the run-up to the Annual Meeting, the Forum will run a series of virtual **"The Great Reset Dialogues"**. These dialogues are a joint initiative of the **World Economic Forum** and **HRH The Prince of Wales**, and take place on alternate Wednesdays. During these dialogues, various key stakeholders will discuss core dimensions of The Great Reset and chart the path ahead.

The World Economic Forum Annual Meeting 2021
