I refer to your email of 23 June 2022 in which you request the following under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA):

On 22 June 2022, according to TVNZ 6 PM news, Air New Zealand has been asked to drop engine maintenance contracts with Turkey. The news piece states that "A controversial Air New Zealand unit quit fixing engines for the Taiwanese and Turkish navies following a top secret Government phone call, 1News can reveal." No logical reason has been given as to why .Can I have the reasons behind the government's decisions on Turkish contracts please.

On 22 July 2022, the deadline for responding to your request was extended until 5 August 2022.

There have been no Government decisions on Turkish contracts. Air New Zealand made its own decisions on future work and was not given any direction by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade. Therefore, I am refusing your request for this information under section 18(e) of the OIA, as the information does not exist.
