Proposed Overseas Travel: Hon Nanaia Mahuta

Portfolio Foreign Affairs

On 1 August 2022, Cabinet:

- authorised the absence of Hon Nanaia Mahuta from New Zealand, from 15 to 19 August 2022, to travel to s6(a) Niue, and Tonga for bilateral visits;
- agreed that she be accompanied by one member of staff.
- approved the expenditure of up to \$24,300 for the travel expenses of the ministerial party as a charge to Vote: Internal Affairs (Members of the Executive Travel);
- 4 **noted** that she will also be accompanied by \$9(2)(g)(i) officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, whose travel costs will be met by their department;
- 5 **agreed** that in her absence:
 - 5.1 Hon David Parker act as Minister of Foreign Affairs;
 - 5.2 Hon Kieran McAnulty act as Minister for Local Government;
 - 5.3 Hon Grant Robertson act as Minister of Local Government for matters relating to Three Waters Reform;
- 6 **noted** that the House is not sitting during her absence.

Proposed Overseas Travel: Hon Nanaia Mahuta

1 I seek Cabinet approval to travel to s6(a) Niue and Tonga. The dates for the proposed tour are 15-19 August 2022, inclusive.

Executive Summary

- If approved, travel to these countries will have the common objective of meaningfully engaging kanohi ki te kanohi with Pacific counterparts in their home context. Aotearoa New Zealand has a special constitutional relationship with s6(a) Niue. Tonga is a key Polynesian partner. A combined visit to these three partners, coming soon after the Prime Minister's visit to Samoa for the 60th anniversary of the Treaty of Friendship, will underscore Aotearoa New Zealand's significant and enduring partnerships in Polynesia, and the priority we attach to reconnecting after a period of virtual engagements and disrupted prior visit plans.
- The visit is well-timed: s6(a)

 Niue's Premier has recently concluded his first official visit to New Zealand and will welcome the first inwards visit by a Minister in five years; and the visit will come shortly after Tonga's announcement to progressively reopen its borders from early August.
- This visit will also provide an opportunity to underscore the significant COVID-19 and economic support Aotearoa New Zealand has provided during these difficult times, and our commitment to continuing to support the economic resilience of our partners in the region. Climate resilience will also be a theme throughout the trip. I am planning to deliver a speech in the Pacific on the Pacific Resilience Approach, and to launch the International Climate Finance Strategy in Tonga.

5.2 **Niue**

- 5.2.1 Reinforce the strength and special character of the Aotearoa New Zealand - Niue relationship, and take the opportunity to highlight that Aotearoa New Zealand prioritises its relationship with Niue following the Premier's visit.
- 5.2.2 Reinforce that Aotearoa New Zealand continues to stand with Niue, as we have throughout the pandemic, as it weathers its first COVID-19 outbreak and economic recovery.
- 5.2.3 Demonstrate a commitment to work with Niue on promoting its language and culture by announcing a regional initiative to support the preservation of Vagahau Niue and other Pacific languages.

5.3 Tonga

- 5.3.1 Reconnect kanohi ki te kanohi to demonstrate the value Aotearoa New Zea and places on the bilateral relationship with Tonga, and take the opportunity to engage and share perspectives on shared bilateral and key regional issues.
- 5.3.2 Further consolidate the relationship gains on the back of the significant support we have provided to Tonga in managing the impacts from the Hunga Tonga Hunga Ha'apai volcanic eruption and tsunami, and the COVID-19 outbreak.

Outline of Proposed Visit

If travel is approved, the programme will include a series of bilateral meetings with the three governments, community events and visits to development activities supported by New Zealand. For example:

6.2 In **Niue** I will attend a special session of the Fale Fono and meet with Cabinet. I intend to visit the high school, and discuss New Zealand's

- support for language revitalisation, and the hospital to acknowledge the work by Niue's medical teams in responding to the pandemic.
- 6.3 As well as meeting with the Prime Minister, Foreign Minister, and Cabinet, in **Tonga** I intend to also meet with the King. In addition, my programme will see me deliver a keynote speech on Pacific resilience and New Zealand's climate finance commitments, launch a new bilateral health workforce development activity and meet with Tonga's humanitarian disaster responders.
- An NZDF asset will be required to facilitate the visit, given commercial linkages into and across the region remain challenging. I will depart Auckland on Monday 15 August, travelling to s6(a) On Wednesday 17 August I will travel to Niue, overnighting there, before travelling to Tonga on Thursday 18 August. I will return from Nuku'alofa on Friday 19 August.

Ministerial Party

I propose to be accompanied by a member of my office staff. Officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade will accompany me. I also intend to invite members of the press on the tour.
