Report to Cabinet: Minister for Disarmament and Arms Control travel to Canberra, Australia, 6-8 September 2022

- 1 I recommend that Cabinet note this report on my travel to Canberra, Australia from 6-8 September 2022.
- 2 The primary purpose of the travel s6(a) on issues related to disarmament and arms control, as well as on issues like PACER Plus, AANZFTA, and RCEP in my capacity as Minister of State for Trade and Export Growth.
- 3 Within that broad goal, I sought to:
  - Reinforce our commitment to working with Australia on disarmament and nonproliferation issues ands6(a)
  - Support the continuing implementation of PACER Plus, s6(a)
  - In the context of PACER Plus' accompanying labour mobility arrangement, explore opportunities to collaborate more closely with Australia on regional labour mobility issues, to ensure Pacific Island countries are supported to maximise the benefits of participation in our respective schemes and mitigate any possible negative effects.
  - Support the upgrading of AANZFTA and the implementation of RCEP s6(a)
