I refer to your email of 17 July 2023 in which you request the following under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA):

- 1. a summary of all projects funded, projected cost, payments made and expected completion dates.
- 2. a copy of MFATs procedure/policy around managing corruption, conflicts of interest and bribery for these projects.
- 3. A list of all audits and assessments of funded projects undertaken so far.

On 14 August 2023, the timeframes for responding to your request were extended by an additional 20 working days because responding to your request necessitated the review of a large quantity of information, (section 15A(1)(a) of the OIA refers).

Please note that data released in this response is correct as at 21 July 2023 and contains activities that are subject to ongoing review, which may have data corrections in the future. However, this date also means that more recent information than that provided in the previously referred request is included.

The information relevant to your request is attached.

We have withheld some information under section 9(2)(f)(iv) of the OIA, to protect constitutional conventions for the time being which protect the confidentiality of advice tendered by Ministers of the Crown and officials.

Information relevant to part 1 and 3 of your request is located on pages 1-84.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (the Ministry) uses a weighted expenditure method to calculate how much spending on an activity is counted towards climate funding:

- If an activity is tagged as 'Principal" to Climate Change Adaptation or Mitigation then 100% of expenditure is counted.
- Activities tagged 'Significant' to only Climate Change Adaptation or Mitigation are counted as 30% of expenditure.
- Activities tagged 'Significant' to Climate Change Adaptation or Mitigation, as well as 'Principal' to Disaster Risk Reduction, are counted as 50% of expenditure.

Please note, regarding "ACT-0100295 - Provincial Airfield Upgrades", the 2023 weighted expenditure for this activity is a negative figure. This is due to the internal financial approach taken to account for the co-funding contribution to Provincial Airfield Upgrades, by the Government of Australia.

Activity Monitoring Assessments (AMA) and Activity Completion Assessments (ACA) are internal reports prepared by the Ministry's Activity Managers. In addition, each year the Ministry's Audit and Risk Division undertakes a Quality Management Review of a number of Development Programme Activities.

Regarding part 2 of your request, the Ministry does not have a procedure/policy around managing corruption, conflicts of interest and bribery, which are specific to climate change projects. The following procedures/policies are relevant to all development projects and activities:

- MFAT statement on conflicts of interest
- Fraud Prevention and response Policy

These documents are located on pages 85-92 of the information being released to you.

Some programmes (such as the Climate Change Programme) undertake structured independent evaluations. The climate portfolio overall is subject to independent oversight, such as:

Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade statement on Conflicts of Interest

Summary

This statement draws together the Ministry's various policies, processes and guidance for disclosing conflicts of interest. It is intended to help manage effectively the risk of staff conflicts of interest not being declared and managed appropriately. The statement provides links to Ministry policies and processes, which have been updated to reflect whole-of-government guidance issued by the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE).

What is a conflict of interest?

A conflict of interest is where the responsibilities you have as an employee or office holder in a public organisation are affected by some other interest you have in your private life. Conflicts of interest can be actual, potential or perceived, and they need to be managed carefully.

The nature of MFAT's business requires us to have stricter parameters around conflicts of interest than many other organisations. Situations in which a conflict of interest may typically arise include:

- When staff are involved in the recruitment or performance assessment of other staff, consultants and contractors with whom they have a close personal relationship;
- When staff are involved in the purchase of goods and services or the granting of funds on behalf of MFAT;
- When staff are involved in the development of foreign, trade and development policy that could result in a financial benefit for them; and
- When staff are offered gifts or hospitality by virtue of their official position.

Different types of conflicts

A conflict can be categorised as financial, non-financial or conflict of roles.

- Financial conflicts of interest A financial conflict of interest is any situation where you stand to gain or lose financially from a decision you are asked to make.
- <u>Non-financial conflicts of interest</u> A non-financial conflict of interest is any situation where you are not affected financially by a decision but are <u>affected</u> in some other way that might make you biased or appear to be biased.

Interests of relatives and friends – Considering the interests of relatives and friends require careful judgement. If they have an interest that overlaps with the duties of an employee, then there might be a Col.

 <u>Conflict of roles</u> - A conflict of roles can arise in any situation where you are a <u>decision</u>-maker for two different organisations about the same matter.

How to disclose and manage a conflict of interest

When a conflict of interest arises:

- Staff should declare actual, potential or perceived conflicts of interest to their manager. Where there is uncertainty staff should err on the side of openness and disclose the interest;
- Managers should manage conflicts of interest carefully and constructively and with appropriate consultation; and
- The conflicts, and the process for managing them, must be recorded in writing.

The options for managing a conflict of interest should be proportionate to the seriousness of the conflict. There are a range of measures for managing a conflict of interest, including:

- doing nothing: other than maintaining a written disclosure of the conflict;
- restricting: imposing restrictions on the person's further involvement in the matter;
- recruiting: engaging an independent third party to oversee all or part of the process and verify its integrity;
- removing: where the person chooses, or is asked, to be removed completely from the matter;
- **relinquishing:** where the person relinquishes the private interest that created the conflict; or
- **resigning:** where the person resigns from their position with the Ministry. (This should only be considered if the conflict of interest can't be resolved in any other workable way.)

Where to go for advice?

Guidance for identifying and managing conflicts of interest can be found in the following documents:

Personal conduct:

- For guidance refer to the Ministry's <u>Code of Conduct</u> paragraphs 4.10 to 4.19
- If you need to declare a standing conflict of interest, complete a <u>Conflict of Interest declaration</u> and submit it to your manager

Procurement

For guidance on both International Development Cooperation (IDC) and Departmental procurement activity, refer to process: Manage commercial conflicts of interest.

Recruitment

All selection panel members have a duty to identify and address any real or potential conflicts of interest related to an applicant and to record them on a declaration.

If you are involved in recruitment, complete the temple <u>Conflict of Interest</u> <u>declaration for panel members</u>.

Where to file Conflicts of Interest outcome?

The outcome of the conflicts of interest should be filed on the staff member's personal file in GDM unless it relates to a procurement or recruitment, in which case it should be documented in the procurement or recruitment file respectively.

Conflicts of Interest Register

Staff are required to send completed CoI forms where a potential, perceived or actual conflict has been identified to the <u>AUR mailbox</u> and the information will be recorded in the CoI register which has limited access to protect individuals' privacy. Managers will still be responsible for managing and documenting the conflict as at present. Please note that a form should be completed for all conflicts with the exception of the following:

Fraud prevention and response policy

POLICY

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to set the Ministry's expectations when dealing with fraud, including corruption.

Application

This policy applies to all Ministry staff, consultants and contractors.

This policy will apply to all fraud and corruption incidents, whether suspected, alleged or proven that are either:

- Committed against the Ministry by a person; or
- Committed by a Ministry staff, officer, director or business partner against a third party.
- Committed in New Zealand, within the aid program and at Posts.

Responsibilities

The following roles have specific responsibilities under this policy:

Role	Responsibility
Delegated authorities	As set out in the <u>Instrument of Delegation</u> .
Senior Leadership Team Management Team	 Develops, implements and maintains appropriate measures to prevent and detect fraud including: internal controls internal and external audit employee training communicating the Ministry's fraud policy on a regular basis.
All Ministry staff, consultants and contractors	 Follow all internal policies and processes. Report all instances of suspected or alleged fraud to AUR as soon as become aware of such allegations. Cooperate with any investigation of fraud. Apply lessons learned from fraud investigations.
Audit and Risk Division	Advise on investigation of the alleged fraud.

	 Provide coordination of parties if investigation required. Complete Fraud Report.
HR Business Partner	Advise on disciplinary actions required.

	 Provide the Ministry with copies of any investigation reports. Apply any remedial actions resulting from the investigation.

Context

Ministry employees, consultants and contractors have been entrusted with management of public resources and are required to apply those resources for the public benefit and not for personal gain.

Three conditions often associated with fraud and corruption:

- Incentive/pressure motivation to commit the fraud e.g. financial pressure.
- Opportunity circumstances that allow the fraud to occur.
- Attitude/rationalisation excuse given of why committed the fraud e.g. "everyone is doing it"; "no checks in place to stop me".

Consequently, the Ministry requires all employees, consultants, contractors and other MFAT-funded entities at all times to act honestly, with integrity and to safeguard the resources for which they are responsible.

Staff employed in New Zealand reporting suspected fraud as a protected disclosure (under the Protected Disclosures Act (2000)), will receive the protections against retaliation specified in that Act.

Principles

The Ministry manages fraud and corruption under the following principles:

- The Ministry is committed to preventing, detecting and responding to fraud and corruption threats.
- Ministry has appropriate internal controls to prevent and detect fraud
- The Ministry adopts a zero tolerance approach to fraud and corruption. Deliberate
 fraud by Ministry staff, consultants or contractors is a serious breach of the Ministry's
 Code of Conduct. All confirmed fraud and corruption incidents are considered serious
 misconduct.

• The Ministry will honour its legal obligation to act fairly, honestly and in good faith when conducting investigations.

Policy statements

- 1. The Ministry defines fraudulent activity as:
 - Theft or misappropriation of Ministry assets and equipment including cash, laptops, IPads, mobile phones and other equipment.
 - Offering or receiving something of value to improperly influence a procurement process (e.g. facilitation payments).
 - Bribery, corruption or abuse of office.
 - Forging documents or making false statements to obtain a benefit to which a person is not entitled e.g. fictitious invoices, falsifying approval of payments, providing false references or qualifications.
 - Improper use or release of commercially/politically sensitive documents, information or intellectual property.
 - Collusion and influencing decisions that will result in a personal benefit.
 - Theft or misappropriation of aid funding or assets purchased using aid funding.
- 2. The Ministry will establish and monitor the effectiveness of it internal controls.
- 3. Employees are required to report all instances of suspected or alleged fraud to Senior Adviser Audit, AUR as soon as become aware of such allegations.
- 4. All reported cases of fraud, or suspected fraud, will be investigated.
- 5. The Ministry will take disciplinary action where fraud is substantiated, and may refer to the police.
- 6. The Ministry will act to recover lost money or property from fraudulent activity.
- 7. The Ministry will assist with the prosecution of fraud offenders where required.

Exceptions management and consequences of policy breach or non-compliance

Any deviation from this policy must be approved in advance by the appropriate authority as defined in the Instrument of Delegation. If this is not specifically defined in the Instrument of Delegation, then the Deputy Secretary of the relevant division where the deviation is to occur must approve any deviation in advance. The deviation must be notified to the policy owner and sponsor, and the Divisional Manager, Audit and Risk.

Unauthorised breaches of this policy may be viewed seriously by the Ministry as a breach of the Code of Conduct. The Code of Conduct states that "employees are expected to fully comply with Ministry policies in their work". Depending on the circumstances, breach of this policy may result in disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal. Any such breaches should be notified to the policy owner and sponsor and the Divisional Manager, Audit and Risk.
