I refer to your email of 12 September 2023 in which you request the following under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA):

- 1. All communications between MFAT and other government departments and/or agencies both in New Zealand and internationally about the Berserk expedition to Antarctica, which resulted in the loss of three crew lives when the yacht sank.
- 2. Any reports, notes, briefings or other communications following a meeting between MFAT officials and the surviving crew members on their return to New Zealand.

Please note that your requests have been numbered for ease of reference.

On 10 October 2023, the timeframes for responding to your request were extended by an additional 30 working days. This was because responding to your request necessitated the search for and review of a large quantity of historic information, and due to consultations necessary to make a decision on your request (section 15A(1) of the OIA refers).

We have interpreted the first part of your request to be for all communications that originated from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (the Ministry) or were sent directly to the Ministry by another New Zealand government agency or a foreign government agency about the Berserk expedition to Antarctica in 2011.

We have made every possible effort to locate the documents in scope of your request, including assessing previous OIAs on this topic dating back to 2011, and conducting a hard copy file review.

Unfortunately, we have been unable to locate the original, unredacted versions of these documents. We are therefore unable to confirm whether some of the information requires ongoing protection under the OIA. Despite reasonable efforts to locate the original, unredacted version of these documents, the information cannot be found. We are refusing the originals under section 18(e) of the OIA.

The material able to be located is attached and where identifiable, these redactions were made under the following sections of the OIA:

- 6(a): to avoid prejudicing the security or defence of New Zealand or the international relations of the New Zealand Government;
- 6(b)(i): to protect the passing of information from another government on a confidential basis;

- 6(c): to prejudice the maintenance of the law, including the prevention, investigation, and detection of offences, and the right to a fair trial;
- 9(2)(a): to protect individuals' privacy; and
- 9(2)(g)(i): to protect the free and frank expression of opinions by departments.

In addition, we believe it necessary to apply further redactions to some information under the following sections of the OIA:

- 9(2)(a): to protect individuals' privacy; and
- 9(2)(k): improper gain or improper advantage.

Where the information has been withheld under section 9 of the OIA, we have identified no public interest in releasing the information that would override the reasons for withholding it.

Please note that it is our policy to proactively release our responses to official information requests where possible. ain Miller and myself spoke to Mr Andhoy this after the ATV and Norwegian Consul from a celebrate Norwegian Consul from a celebrate Norwegian and a celebrate Norwegian dream") following his successful North West Passage mission and subsequently wrote to the Norwegian PM for support.

2) He has been planning the expedition for 18 months and said his plans had had extensive coverage in Norwegian media including his planned ATV trip to South Pole. He has had no contact with Norway Polar Institute or Norway Foreign Affairs to the best of my knowledge. (He was surprised NZ hadn't heard of the expedition given extensive media coverage.)The expedition left from Gnome, Alaska in April 2009 and travelled through Russia/Japan/Phillipines/NZ before heading to Cape Adare. He left Dunedin on 24 Jan 2011, arriving at McMurdo Ice channel on 11 Feb.

3)He claimed to have fuel delivered and stored at South Pole by a Russian Victor Serov and in event of his plan failing he intended to keep driving across the continent to Troll Station. The only reason he turned around at 88 degress south(approx 200km from South pole) was to return to Ross Island to assist with the SAROP. He believed for 5 days that his men could have survived on the beaches near Cape Bird. He now believes they are lost at sea.

4)The Honda ATV's were very reliable and they travelled non stop sleeping on each others backs to keep the engines always running and living on pasta and onions.

5)He believes his yacht crew made a fatal error when warned of an approaching storm by the "HMNZS Wellington" and moved out of the shelter of Winter Quarters Bay for some completely unknown reason. He cant believe they did this. He had planned to do the ATV trip to South Pole in about 14 days returning to "Berserk" and then sailing to Antarctic Peninsula and South Georgia. (He also indicated a plan to winter the yacht at McMurdo or the lee of Beaufort Island)

6)He has left some fuel on the Ross Ice shelf and his ATV's and equipment, (incl 280 litres of fuel) on a US

snow berm near Scott Base. He stated these as his personal property and not owned by any sponsor and he may return to travel through the McMurdo Dry Valleys on a new expedition to cross from McMurdo to 7 Station sometime in future.

7) He claimed he got the GPS co-ordinates of the US South Pole Traverse route from some website and generally followed the route, although flags were somewhat infrequent. He found the route very easy going and fast enabling him to proceed at up to 20-30 kms an hour but did encounter minus 45 degree temps on the Polar Plateau.

7)He thanked NZ and US for the resources involved in the SAROP.

8)I advised him of a further NZ Govt mtg with MFAT and MSA tomorrow in Wellington concerning the expedition planning in terms of Antarctic Treaty obligations and NZ Govt costs of SAR.

Just an observation, a number of times his story shifted and I would question his reliability, even the fact that official Information Act. he got so close to the South Pole. That said he clearly had considerable extreme environment skill sets

As discussed, here is the email from Jarle Adhoy. I am about to acknowledge receipt of his email with a holding reply - which will be copied to you -(PLO) but meanwhile have undertaken some background work which is:

- .1. Regarding Leonard James Banks, presumed lost with the BERSERK. I have sought -advice from Insp Gerry Prins at Police National Headquarters on what might be done about a death certificate. Gerry is one of the Police Liaison Officers (PLO) who works with PCCNZ during SAR incidents.
- RCCN id not contact the PLO during the BERSERK search because of the incident location. Police therefore did not inform a NZ coroner, and Gerry indicated that they may not have done so anyway because the incident occurred outside NZ territorial waters and those presumed lost were not New Zealanders. He suggested I contact the British High Commission (Tony McLeod, a former senior NZ Police officer now in the consular branch). Tony was overseas so I spoke with Peter Collins. He thought their office could assist by relaying the situation to their London office, for them to facilitate a resolution. Peter suggested I forward the relevant information to him, copied to Kelly Bevin and Tony McLeod. This is yet to be done.
 - 2. Jarle's request to talk direct to HMNZS WELLINGTON: I have discussed this with our Navy contact at HQ Joint Forces New Zealand who is comfortable with this request being referred to him for consideration.
 - 3. Jarle's request for the Scott Base phone number: This number is available in the Christchurch telephone directory, however, I have spoken direct to Lou Sanson who is happy to handle the response to Jarle while Lou is at Scott Base for the next few days.

I'd be grateful for your guidance on the next steps, particularly in regard to Mr Banks.

Media enquiries which don't directly relate to NZ's SAR response are also being directed to the Honorary Consul.
- 4. ATS and CCAMLR notifications on the incident completed.

Hi all

An update on the Berserk incident follows.

- 1. MFAT/RCCNZ meeting: RCCNZ (Clifford, Seward) and MFAT (Schwalger, Leslie) met with Mr Andhoy (owner and skipper of the vessel), the Norwegian Counsellor from Canberra and the Wellington-based Norwegian Honorary Consul this morning. Key points follow:
 - We took the opportunity to express our condolences on the apparent loss of the Berserk and its three
 crew, explain the NZ SAR response and note that the NZ Government was leaving open the option of
 SAR cost recovery (comment: this is uncommon and will be considered carefully). RCCNZ also
 explained the process for making a decision to suspend the SAR operation. Mr Andhoy and the
 Norwegian Counsellor expressed sincere appreciation for New Zealand's SAR efforts. Mr Andhoy
 said he thought the SAR operation should be called off.
 - We registered our concerns about the apparent ill-preparedness of the expedition and our assessment that the members of the expedition had failed to fulfill its environmental permitting obligations. Mr Andhoy strongly disputed the expedition was fool hardy and went through various explanations of what the crew had done in terms of preparations. He asserted that the expedition was well known about in Norway and had the Norwegian PM's blessing. Andhoy commented that he had travelled to Antarctica previously and had not needed permits on those occasions. In fact his expeditions had been celebrated by a number of countries.
 - We were firm in our response that he had ignored advice from New Zealand officials that he was required to submit an Initial Environmental Evaluation and that this was an offence under New Zealand law. We explained that he may have also committed other offences as well and that we would be considering whether to take the matter further. Mr Andhoy was cavalier in his response, refusing to accept responsibility (for example claiming that he was not responsible as he had passed over the skipper ship of the vessel once he had landed in Antarctica, that they considered Antarctica as nomans land etc).



2. **Media:** Radio NZ has sought information on the meeting this morning and we have provided the <u>attached</u> response. Other agencies (eg RCCNZ and Antarctica NZ may wish to draw on these points, as appropriate).

we retrained from making public comment on: (i) the

preparedness of the voyage, and (ii) that we are considering whether to take action for EIA non-compliance.

NZ Herald media article from this morning is <u>attached</u>. A snippet of the intense Norwegian media interest in this incident is also <u>attached</u> (thanks to The Hague).

- 3. SAR operation: Director of MNZ is likely to make a decision today whether to suspend the SAR operation. RCCNZ is preparing an updated media release on the SAR side of the house. RCCNZ hosted Andhoy at its HQ this morning following our meeting so he could go through first-hand the SAR response.
- 4. Andhoy and Massie are scheduled to leave New Zealand the day after tomorrow.

Let us take this opportunity to thank all those who have been involved in responding to this incident (primarily

Not sure why we are going to so much trouble - told him of obligations when distress situation indicated by distress beacon activation, and that we cannot assume all well until contact made.

Jarle said VHF channel 16 and also Iridium on ship when they are anchored off may not receive signals in that area.

The Captain on board now, Tom BELLIKA, likes to go very far offshore if weather is bad - he is experienced and has been in ice before. Weather he understands on the day from JRCC Norway and RCCNZ said ice conditions very good, and the 5-7 metre waves and 80kn winds are a walk in the park.

Shore party has made scheds with yacht every 24 hours and the plan is if they cannot make contact then they call next 1200 and 0600hrs NZDT, so have been trying that. Lack of contact may be because of broken phone. Knows from experience that if there are problems with katabatic winds skipper will go far offshore. If not in area of Beaufort and Franklin Island they would only have set sail offshore and it's not worth spending a lot of time and research for them - thinks if they are not in McMurdo Sound it's not logical they are just floating around. Seamanship wise there's no way they would have abandoned the yacht.

Yacht should turn its iridium phone on at 1200 and 0600 NZDT. Jarle will call back in 12 hours. Has great thankfulness for all involved and keen no-one jeopardises their safety in a search for the yacht.

Marit was with family, but in a separate room for this call because of the distress on other family members present. Marit mistakenly believed search had been terminated. She was informed that the search was continuing, with the SPIRIT OF ENDERBYPROFESSOR KROMOV yet to undertake another search as it leaves the Ross Sea in a couple of days time. She believed we had turned down initiative by RCC Bodoe to have Norwegian satellite imagery company provide imagery to assist RCCNZ in our search effort. She understood that imagery at the time of the EPIRB activation and the following day or so would not be of use because of the cloud cover associated with the largest storm of the season, but could not understand why RCCNZ would not utilise imagery that could be made available now. She asked how the search area was determined and SARMAP was described. Her distress was evident during the conversation, and understandable, however, the facts we have available were explained, together with the most likely and least likely scenarios. It was further explained that the searching vessels were confident that BERSERK, had it been afloat in the area searched, which was larger than the area calculated by



SARMAP, would have been sighted. I undertook, however, to further consider the satellite imagery question and call her again. Time in Norway at the end of the call (0654 UTC) was 0710 am and she comfortable with receiving a call at any time during the (Norwegian) day.







Dear Kyrre

Thank you for your email on behalf of the relatives and friends of Tom and Robert, whom the New Zealand SAR authorities regretfully believe were lost at sea with the BERSERK on 22 February this year.

In regard to your question about whether Rescue Coordination Centre New Zealand (RCCNZ) considered the use of satellite imagery during the search for the BERSERK, the answer is yes, we did. There were other considerations, however, which led RCCNZ to decide not to pursue this option at the time. These considerations included:

- The distress signal from BERSERK's emergency beacon was received during a severe storm. Photographic images would not have been useful because of cloud cover. Even high definition radar imagery would have been of doubtful use because of the stormy sea conditions and the relatively small size of BERSERK.
- Search conditions in the area subsequently became very good, with calm seas and excellent visibility for

searching by the two ships and the helicopter from one of those ships. The searchers, and RCCNZ, had high confidence that BERSERK would have been sighted had it been afloat. The fact that BERSERK's life raft was found, and other, much smaller, objects lost overboard from the Navy vessel while it was searching during the storm, may help you understand why RCCNZ had high confidence that BERSERK would have been sighted had it been afloat.

In regard to your question as to what would it take for the search to be recommenced it is now three months since we searched for BERSERK and RCCNZ has not received any new information about the incident and therefore, regretfully, there is no justification for resuming the search. Also, it is now winter in the Antarctica and there are simply no resources there to conduct a search.

I am sorry that my responses can not be more encouraging. RCCNZ has considered all information available and, regretfully, can not justify re-opening the search for BERSERK.

I am representing a small group of relatives and friends of two of the missing persons from the sailboat "Berserk", lost at sea on Feb., the 22nd 2011.

We have, since the beginning of march, been trying to get the Norwegian Dep, of Foreign affairs and the Dep. of Justice to use satellite photos taken from the area two days after the emergency beacon came from "Berserk" in the McMurdo-area.

Our main goal is to locate the boat.

According to Norwegian specialists who has seen quicklink-formats of the pictures, it will be possible to see the ship - if it still was on the surface.

To us relatives and friends, that would give us answers to some of the major questions that has bothered us since that day: what happend with the crew and boat?

We have been turned down by both Departments, and given the answer that it is the rescuecenter of New Zealand who is in charge for this, and that there is nothing the Norwegian Departments can do.

We would therefor kindly request your answer on the following two questions:

* Was/has the use of satellitephotos ever (been) considered in the search for "Berserk"?

* What would it take for NZs rescuecenter to resume the search?
