# Russia Sanctions Amendment Regulations (No 2) 2024

Portfolio **Foreign Affairs** 

On 9 May 2024, the Cabinet Legislation Committee:

- s6(a) 1
- of Foreign Affairs noted that the Russia Sanctions Regulations (No 2) 2024 (the Regulations) fall within scope 2 of the decision referred to in paragraph 1 above;
- noted that, before recommending that regulations be made under the Russia Sanctions Act 3 2022, the responsible Minister must be satisfied that:
  - 3.1 the regulations are appropriate to respond to threats to the sovereignty or territorial integrity of Ukraine or another country;
  - 3.2 the United Nations Security Council is unlikely to act or has acted insufficiently;

## Russia Sanctions Amendment Regulations 2024

#### **Proposal**

1 This paper seeks authorisation for submission to the Executive Council of the Russia Sanctions Regulations (No 2) 2024 (the Regulations).

#### **Policy**

- The Minister of Foreign Affairs is the Responsible Minister under the Russia 2 Sanctions Act 2022 (the Act) and therefore has discretion to decide whether to recommend that sanctions regulations be made under the Act.
- s6(a) 3
- The Regulations will implement sanctions measures under the Russia Sanctions Act 4 2022, designating individuals and entities providing material and/or strategic support for Russia's illegal invasion of Ukraine. Those designated are involved in: (a) Russia's military-industrial complex, and the provision of support to the Russian military, including the transfer of weapons to Russia from the DPRK and from Iran; and (b) the forced transfer of Ukrainian children. The Regulations will also provide for the replacement of the Customs Hamonised System codes relevant to the recently adopted G7 plus oil price cap on Russian origin oil, with the codes in New Zealand's Working Tariff Document. y Released

#### Compliance

- The Regulations are in line with the intent and purpose of the Act and compliant with 6 each of the following:
  - 6.1 the principles of the Treaty of Waitangi;
  - 6.2 the rights and freedoms contained in the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act 1990 and the Human Rights Act 1993;
  - 6.3 the principles and guidelines set out in the Privacy Act 2020;
  - 6.4 relevant international standards and obligations;
  - 6.5 the Legislation Guidelines (2021 edition), which are maintained by the Legislation Design and Advisory Committee.

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#### RESTRICTED

- Section 8 of the Act sets out a threshold which the responsible Minister must be satisfied has been met before recommending that an Order in Council be made with regard to sanctions under section 9 of the Act. The Section 8 threshold is that: (i) the regulations are appropriate to respond to threats to the sovereignty or territorial integrity of Ukraine or another country; and (ii) the United Nations Security Council is unlikely to act or has acted insufficiently.
- The Minister is satisfied that the threshold in section 8 has been met for the sanctions measures in the recommended Regulations, s6(a)

### **Regulations Review Committee**

There are no grounds for the Regulations Review Committee to draw the Regulations to the attention of the House of Representatives under Standing Order 327.

### **Certification by Parliamentary Counsel**

The draft Regulations have been certified by the PCO as being in order for submission to Cabinet.

### **Impact Analysis**

#### **Publicity**

The new regulations will be publicised through a press release and an update to the Sanctions Register (as required by section 14 of the Act). The Ministry will also email information to those who subscribe to its Russia Sanctions Updates service.

### Proactive release

This paper will be released proactively with appropriate redactions within 30 business days of the decisions being confirmed by Cabinet. It is expected that the annuancement will have been made within this period.

### Consultation

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade has consulted the following agencies in developing the draft regulations: Parliamentary Counsel Office, Crown Law Office, Customs New Zealand, Department of Internal Affairs, Financial Markets Authority, Immigration New Zealand, New Zealand Police, Ministry of Justice, Ministry of Transport, Reserve Bank, Oranga Tamariki - Ministry for Children and Treasury.

#### Recommendations

The Minister of Foreign Affairs recommends that the Cabinet Legislative Committee:
