Government Response to Petition of Katrina Mitchell-Kouttab: Gazaeigh Atta **Call for New Zealand to Take Further Actions**

Government response to the petition of Katrina Mitchell-Kouttab: Gaza - call for New Zealand to take further actions

Purpose

This paper seeks approval of the Government's response to the Petitions Committee referral of the petition entitled "Katrina Mitchell-Kouttab: Gaza - call for New Zealand to take further actions".

Background

- 2 On 2 August 2024, the Petitions Committee referred the petition of Katrina Mitchell-Kouttab to the Minister of Foreign Affairs for response under Standing Order 380.
- The petition requests that the House of Representatives call for an unconditional and internationally monitored ceasefire in Gaza; provide further humanitarian assistance to Gaza; demand an end to Israel's illegal occupation of Palestinian territories; condemn the targeting of civilians and what is described by UN special rapporteur as meeting the threshold of genocide against Palestinians; condemn unlawful violent settler behaviour in the West Bank; and note that 15,814 people have signed a similar online petition.

Comment on the Government response

- I recommend that the Government inform the petitioner that the Government is not able to respond positively to the petitioner's request as it is not the role of the House of Representatives to take such decisions for the Government, but rather it remains appropriate for the Minister of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry to continue to make decisions on foreign policy, including decisions on the allocation of humanitarian assistance.
- This position would be consistent with the response of the Government to the Petition of Dr David Cumin in CAB-24-MIN-0188 that the House of Representatives cease funding the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for

Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA). It was the Government's determination in that instance that New Zealand's financial support for humanitarian and development agencies should continue to rest with the Minister of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry.

- Whilst the Government is unable to respond positively to the petitioner's request, New Zealand's position remains clear and consistent on many of the issues raised by the petitioner:
 - 7.1 New Zealand has long called for a ceasefire.
 - 7.2 New Zealand continues to urge all parties to exercise the utmost restraint and take all necessary steps to de-escalate tensions and end the conflict.
 - 7.3 New Zealand supports the efforts of countries working hard to find a diplomatic solution to ending the conflict in Gaza.
 - 7.4 New Zealand calls on all parties to protect civilians and comply with international humanitarian law.
 - 7.5 New Zealand continues to call also for an urgent restart of the Middle East Peace Process and a two-state solution to the conflict as the best path for a durable and lasting peace in the region.
- The Government response provides further detail on the New Zealand Government's position and response on the conflict in Gaza.

Timing of the Government response

9 The government response must be presented to the House by 25 October 2024.

10 The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade has been consulted.

11 There are no financial implications for New Zealand.
