Thank you for your email of 1 July 2025 in which you requested the following under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA):

"I would be grateful for all official information on the MFAT investigation in 2021 into Air New Zealand's exports of GE LM2500 marine engines, in particular those destined for Saudi Arabia, including MFAT's interactions with other bodies and the investigation's outcomes (in other words, what recommendations were taken up as a result of the investigation's findings).

Please exclude information that is administrative or trivial in nature."

Your request has been interpreted as being for:

- 1- Formal documentation (e.g., reports, findings, summaries) related to MFAT's 2021 investigation into Air New Zealand's exports of GE LM2500 marine engines, especially those destined for Saudi Arabia.
- 2- MFAT's communications or consultations with external bodies (e.g., other government agencies, international partners) in relation to decisions made/actions taken in this investigation.
- 3- Outcomes report resulting from the investigation into Air New Zealand's exports of GE LM2500 marine engines.

On 30 July 2025, the timeframes for responding to your request were extended by an additional 30 working days because responding to your request necessitated the review of a large quantity of information, and due to the consultations necessary to decide on your request (section 15A(1)(a) and (b) of the OIA refers).

On 10 September 2025, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (the Ministry) advised you that a decision had been made on your OIA request and that the information relevant to your request was in the final stages of preparation.

Please find this information attached. Some of the information is withheld under the following sections of the OIA:

• 6(a): to avoid prejudicing the security or defence of New Zealand or the international relations of the New Zealand Government;

- 6(b)(i): to protect the passing of information from another government on a confidential basis;
- 9(2)(a): to protect individuals' privacy;
- 9(2)(ba)(i): to protect the supply of confidential information by a third party;
- 9(2)(g)(i): to protect the free and frank expression of opinions by departments;
- 9(2)(g)(ii): to protect officers and employees from improper pressure or harassment; and
- 9(2)(h): to maintain legal professional privilege.

Where the information was withheld under section 9 of the OIA, no public interest in releasing the information has been identified that would override the reasons for withholding it.

Following the Ministry's internal investigation and a commodity determination process, the export controls decision was published on the Ministry's website: www.mfat.govt.nz/en/media-and-resources/export-controls-decision.

In April 2021, in response to heightened public interest and media coverage concerning New Zealand businesses exporting to countries subject to scrutiny over human rights and humanitarian law concerns, the Deputy Chief Executive, Policy at the Ministry commissioned an independent review of the Ministry's Export Controls framework. The review was conducted by David Smol and resulted in the report titled *A Review of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade's Export Controls Regime*. The report provided an assessment of the New Zealand export controls framework and offered recommendations for strengthening it, and is available on the Ministry's website: https://www.mfat.govt.nz/assets/Trade-General/Brokering-weapons-AND-Trading-weapons-and-controlled-chemicals/Export-Controls-Report-22-July-2021.pdf.

Hi Peter,

Thanks for the call with Stuart earlier. It caused a rewrite to the email I was about to send you – a good thing as it meant that many of my questions were answered.

We are seeking a legal opinion on the application of the export control obligations which as discussed, appears to come down to the exact design and nature of the LM2500 engine. We will endeavor to provide answers to your questions regarding these engines (for instance the shock resistant nature) and any other background we can find to assist you. We also note next steps with regards to MFAT informing Customs of the outcome and a way forward for work completed, work in progress, and new work en route to Gas Turbines in Auckland.

Finally, I note your point around the possible need for a permit to return the Saudi engine we have at the moment to MTU in Germany, particularly your comment around seeking a permit anyway while we work through whether one is required or not.

Happy to continue the discussion at any time.

The following can be attributed to an Air New Zealand spokesperson:

"Air New Zealand's Gas Turbines business specialises in the repair and overhaul of gas turbines used for marine and industrial purposes, such as power stations, large ships, fast ferries and sizeable manufacturing or processing plants.

As one of a handful of facilities in the world licensed to repair a certain type of engine used on large vessels, the Gas Turbines business has been contracted to work on naval ship engines from New Zealand, the United States and Australia.

The business also occasionally contracts to carry out ad hoc overflow work from third party repair facilities. It is through a third party contract that work has recently been carried out on two engines and one power turbine module from vessels belonging to the Royal Saudi Navy. The Gas Turbines business has not contracted directly with the Royal Saudi Navy and will not be carrying out any further work of this nature.

The Gas Turbines business is reviewing its contracting processes to ensure it has improved oversight of future work assigned through third party arrangements."

1 Was the repair and overhaul work undertaken in New Zealand or offshore?

In New Zealand. Air NZ's Gas Turbines is based in Auckland.

2 What is the type of gas turbines repaired – was it a military version?

General Electric Marine LM2500 propulsion Engine. I am advised that GE do not produce a military version.

When was the repair and overhaul work undertaken?

The contract was signed with German entity MTU in May 2019 and we contracted through them. We had no direct relationship with the Saudi Navy. The engines were imported into NZ and arrived at Air NZ Gas

Turbines in September 2019. The work on the two engines were completed in 2020, and the work on power turbine unit was due to be completed by March 2021.

Peter,

As discussed, we are working on preparing information to assist you with the process of determining the status of the LM2500 engine with respect to export controls. Given the importance of this determination, we wondered if we could seek a little clarity around the process you will be undertaking and how we might best assist in that.

Specifically;

- 1) What time frame do you have in mind to make this decision? Just as soon as possible,
 - 2) Are their any pre-set criteria you will use to establish your position, or is it simply a case of reviewing the LM2500 against the wording of ML9 in the Strategic Goods List?

https://www.mfat.govt.nz/en/trade/trading-weapons-and-controlled-chemicals/how-your-application-is-assessed/#criteria These are the criteria we use, however if an application doesn't meet a particular criteria, this doesn't necessarily mean it will be automatically denied. The goods, the country of destination, the end-user, the end-use, the overall situation and the various criteria are assessed as a whole to arrive at a decision.

- 3) Does Mfat work alone in this process or is Customs involved in this determination? Customs is not involved. We do consult with Ministers for sensitive applications and may do in this case.
 - 4) We intend to provide a letter or submission to Mfat containing our views and background information on the LM2500. We may also reach out to GE themselves for clarity and supplementary information. It would be helpful to have a deadline for when you will accept information from us to assist with your determination.

We don't have a set deadline. We are seeking advice from other sources as well and are dependent on when they reply, hopefully within the next 7 days. If we did get to a point of having that information I will contact you to see how far off you may be. We would be interested in information from the manufacture, particularly if they have any export controls determinations on the status of the engines from either the State Department or Department of Commerce.

Air New Zealand update on Gas Turbines review

Air New Zealand's review around historic work undertaken by its Gas Turbines business is moving forward at pace.

Air New Zealand Chairman Dame Therese Walsh says as well as commissioning a review by independent external advisers PwC, the airline has appointed a QC to the review team.

"Both our internal review and the external independent review being undertaken by PwC to determine what happened and what needs to be changed are underway. We have now appointed QC Mike Heron to review the licensing requirements for exporting these specific types of engines with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade. We expect to hear the outcome of that review in the next week.

"The full audit will likely take at least two weeks because we will be going over all the files – in some cases manually kept or paper records – even more deeply to ensure we haven't missed anything. This timeframe will also ensure our external advisors PwC have time to review the findings before the final report is reviewed by the Board at the end of February. Our Board will then provide an update on the findings after it has met."

Air New Zealand's Chief Executive Officer Greg Foran says further progress has been made on identifying which country or territory militaries the Gas Turbines business has previously carried out engine repair work for, and that ensuring this is accurate has been critical.

"Over the past decade, engine repair work has been completed for navies in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Norway, Taiwan, Turkey, the United States and the one-off recent piece of work for the Royal Saudi Navy. The type of work undertaken for these customers includes the overhaul and repair of gas turbines, the major components of these being gas generators or power turbines for navy ships.

"At this time Gas Turbines has engine repair work underway in its Auckland workshop for the Australian, Canadian, Taiwanese, Turkish and United States navies and this work is under review.

"We are continuing to move forward with the thorough assessment of our past records to ensure we have examined all of the data, but at this stage in the process these are the navies we are aware of having carried out engine overhaul or repair work for."

Hello Andrew,

Thanks for emailing a record of our discussion.

As you note the key issue is information that would pertain to whether the engine would constitute a "component therefore [of a vessel specially designed or modified for military use] specially designed for military use" as per ML9.a.1. of the List, such as shock resistance as mentioned on General Electric's website.

Thanks you also for undertaking to ascertain if MTU required a permit to export the engines to New Zealand and if they were required by the US State Department to seek a Government over Private Entity assurance letter from the NZ government via Air New Zealand.

With respect to remaining Saudi engine in Air New Zealand's possession, should you wish to re-export that to Germany before we have made a definitive determination on its control status, can I suggest that you apply for an export permit for the engine. MFAT would assess that against the relevant criteria. Should the permit be approved, this would be without prejudice as to determining whether the engine is controlled or not. You also sought advice for the export of similar naval engines to other customers before we have made a definitive determination of their control status. Again it would be prudent to apply for a permit and this would also be without prejudice to as to the final determination of their status.

In the event that you do export with a permit this should be provided to your Customs broker, who is to upload this onto the Trade Single Window system as part of the declaration to Customs in respect of the export. Additionally the export permit has a unique code, which should be entered into the permit code field on the entry in Customs' system.

Thank you for your applications made on 12 and 15 February, and 09 March 2021 for the export of GE LM2500 marine gas turbine engines currently in New Zealand awaiting return to Turkey, the United States, Taiwan and Saudi Arabia. Your application of 09 March also sought a general consent for various countries for anticipated future exports.

As you are aware, it has been necessary to establish the control status of the GE LM2500 marine gas turbine engine. We would like to thank Air New Zealand for its patience while that process was undertaken and for providing information to be considered as a part of the assessment.

The requirement was to determine if GE LM2500 marine gas turbine engines and their variants are a controlled item as per ML9.a.1. New Zealand Strategic Goods List 2019. In particular, whether the engines are a "component therefore [of a warship] specially designed for military use".

It is assessed that the engines are not a controlled item as per the New Zealand Strategic Goods List 2019. Specifically, these engines are not a "component therefore [of a warship] specially designed for military use", in that they do not possess any unique military capabilities or any inherent military technologies.

We have also considered whether the engines may be subject to our expanded catch-all controls for non-controlled goods where the export would be to a military end-user (armed, paramilitary, or police force or militia as defined in the Customs and Excise Act 2018 $\,$ S 97(10)).

The current expanded catch-all controls which came into force on 09 October 2020 are given effect by the attached Gazette Notice. That Notice contains some transitional and permanent exemptions.

As the marine gas turbine engines and related components currently awaiting export from New Zealand are to be ultimately consigned to a military end-user, in each instance, we consider that the catch-all controls apply. However, where the contracts for these engines were concluded prior to 09 October 2020 the engines are exempt from the requirement to obtain an export permit,

Where any negotiations were begun prior to 09 October 2020, and contracts for any of these engines were concluded after 09 October 2020 and before 09 April 2021, the engines are exempt from the requirement to obtain an export permit provided that export takes place before 09 October 2021.

For instances where negotiations were/are begun after 09 October 2021, and contracts subsequently concluded, exports of these engines to military end-users will require a permit. However, if consigned for use in an exempt destination (Australia, Canada, Iceland, Japan, Norway, South Korea, Switzerland, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, ate Official official and a second a second and a second the United States of America or a member state of the European Union) a permit is not required.

Any significant change in circumstances may need to be considered and the exemption for those parts or components or replacement items withdrawn.

Military use or applications, in relation to paragraph (2)(d) and (e), is defined as: "goods or electronic publications incorporated into weapons, or used in the production, maintenance or testing of weapons, or to materially enable or support operations and activities of a military or internal security nature".
- 6. Fundamental or basic research means "experimental or theoretical work undertaken principally to acquire new knowledge of the fundamental principles of phenomena or observable facts, not primarily directed towards a specific practical aim or objective".
- $7.\ A\ terrorist\ act\ is\ as\ defined\ under\ section\ 5\ of\ the\ Terrorism\ Suppression\ Act\ 2002.$

EXPORT CONTROLS DECISION

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade today confirmed it had reached a determination about the controlled goods status of GE LM2500 marine gas turbine engines.

Air New Zealand has undertaken service on these engines for a variety of customers over past years, including the Royal Saudi Navy. Any item found to be controlled under the New Zealand Strategic Goods List requires a permit to be exported further to the Customs and Excise Act 2018.

The Ministry had not previously made a determination about the status of these engines. On the basis of technical information obtained, the Ministry has assessed the engines are not a controlled item. This is because they are not a component specially designed for military use, and they do not possess any unique military capabilities or any inherent military technologies. Given public interest, this determination was reviewed by the Crown Law Office prior to finalisation.

There is value in companies having early contact with the Ministry where there is any question as to whether a good to be exported is controlled. The introduction of catch-all controls in October 2020 now means that even if a good does not fall under the Strategic Goods List, it may still need a permit to be lawfully exported if it is going to a military end user.

More broadly, in line with ministerial commissioning, the Ministry will be carrying out a review of its export controls Released under the Official Information of the Official In regime to ensure it is fit for purpose and demonstrated to be so. The Ministry will provide a draft Terms of Reference for the review to Foreign Minister Mahuta by the end of the week.

- 6. Fundamental or basic research means "experimental or theoretical work undertaken principally to acquire new knowledge of the fundamental principles of phenomena or observable facts, not primarily directed towards a specific practical aim or objective".
- $7.\ A\ terrorist\ act\ is\ as\ defined\ under\ section\ 5\ of\ the\ Terrorism\ Suppression\ Act\ 2002.$

Air New Zealand Gas Turbines review - further update

Air New Zealand continues to progress its internal review and the independent external review being carried out by PwC on its Gas Turbines business is also well underway.

Air New Zealand Chairman Dame Therese Walsh says the airline has now received advice from the QC appointed to review the licensing requirements for exporting the specific type of engines the business was repairing for the Royal Saudi Navy.

"The legal advice we have received from Mike Heron QC is that the export of the two engines to Germany for the Royal Saudi Navy did not require an export permit under the Customs Act, nor did it require a notification to the Secretary of Foreign Affairs and Trade. The advice is that new notification requirements introduced in late 2020 do not apply to contracts entered into before September 2020 (when the notification requirement was expanded for certain military related exports). The contract for this Royal Saudi Navy work was in May 2019. We are discussing this advice with MFAT.

"The independent review by external advisors PwC is well underway and they have had an interim meeting with the Board, but a final report is not expected for a few more weeks. The Board is satisfied with how the reviews are tracking and the interim measures that have been put in place. They have expressed their appreciation for the cooperation and assistance of the Gas Turbines employees involved in the reviews."

Air New Zealand Chief Executive Officer Greg Foran says the internal review is progressing well and early findings have helped the business to identify where there are opportunities to improve processes.

"We have taken immediate steps to ensure all future work of a military or government nature is escalated to Executive level for review, including ethical considerations, and approval before a contract can proceed. We will also work with relevant governmental agencies to ensure our understanding of issues for differing jurisdictions is kept up to date.

"For Air New Zealand, business is more than just revenue, we've got to make sure the work we are doing fits within our values. It's clear we've still got some work to do to make sure our processes support us to make the right decisions and we're committed to getting on and doing it."

Air New Zealand's Gas Turbines business specialises in the repair and overhaul of gas turbines used for marine and industrial purposes, such as power stations, large ships, fast ferries and sizeable manufacturing or processing plants.

As one of a handful of facilities in the world licensed to repair a certain type of engine used on large vessels, the Gas Turbines business has been contracted to work on naval ship engines from New Zealand, the United States and Australia.

The business also occasionally contracts to carry out ad hoc overflow work from third party repair facilities. It is through a third party contract that work has recently been carried out on two engines and one power turbine module from vessels belonging to the Royal Saudi Navy. The Gas Turbines business has not contracted directly with the Royal Saudi Navy and will not be carrying out any further work of this nature.

The Gas Turbines business is reviewing its contracting processes to ensure it has improved oversight of future work assigned through third party arrangements."

Hi all,

I thought I'd provide a brief background to the Saudi Navy issue for you. Also FYI Greg is fronting media tomorrow morning (ZB and RNZ pre-records prior to 7am, TVNZ and AM Show live after 7). Note to be clear, we are still working through the finer details and the below is my understanding of the situation as at this evening:

- Air New Zealand's "Gas Turbines" business has been fixing engines from third parties for 30-40 years, in addition to Air NZ fixing its own aircraft engines.
- The logic is that we have highly skilled aircraft engineers and two engineering bases (AKL and CHC) with occasional spare capacity. Servicing third party engines keeps these bases working and people employed.
- As background, the same engine that powers an aircraft jet engine also powers many naval and civilian ships and civilian ferries. The engines are the same, but instead of spinning the fan blades of an aircraft jet engine at high speed they power a marine propeller and a lower speed.
- Air NZ Gas Turbines is one of a small number of copmpanies accredited to service GE (General Electric) gas turbine engines, meaning we can fix our own engines but also tender for work to fix third party engines.
- The two Saudi Navy engines and one Saudi Navy power unit came to Air NZ through another accredited GE engineering company in Germany. I understand that this was because they were over capacity and it is not uncommon for one GE accredited engineering company to ask others to help out when they have too much work. There is no requirement for Air NZ Gas Turbines to take on this type of third party work if it doesn't want to.
- Air NZ Gas Turbines contracted with this German engineering company to take the Saudi Navy engines in July 2019 and the engines arrived in September 2019. (Note Greg Foran joined Air NZ in February 2020). The work is still ongoing and will be completed next month.

- Air NZ Gas Turbines does not have a direct contract or relationship with the Saudi Navy or defence force.
- Air NZ Gas Turbines contracts with a freight forwarding company to look after all their Export Controls and other legal matters, we while are in the process of validating that everything was in order for this work, our working assumption is it was.
- Once Greg Foran was alerted to this issue around 10 days ago, Air NZ has moved to confirm it will not undertake future work of this nature and is looking into internal governance processes for this part of the business to ensure they are robust.
- You may have seen reports of Air NZ not answering initial questions from media / delaying answers. Part of this is due to the contractual obligations which restricted Air NZ from confirming client details. These have now been overcome but clearly we should have responded quicker.

Our media statement is below:

"The following can be attributed to an Air New Zealand spokesperson:

Air New Zealand's Gas Turbines business specialises in the repair and overhaul of gas turbines used for marine and industrial purposes, such as power stations, large ships, fast ferries and sizeable manufacturing or processing plants.

As one of a handful of facilities in the world licensed to repair a certain type of engine used on large vessels, the Gas Turbines business has been contracted to work on naval ship engines from New Zealand, the United States and Australia.

The business also occasionally contracts to carry out ad hoc overflow work from third party repair facilities. It is through a third party contract that work has recently been carried out on two engines and one power turbine module from vessels belonging to the Royal Saudi Navy. The Gas Turbines business has not contracted directly with the Royal Saudi Navy and will not be carrying out any further work of this nature.

The Gas Turbines business is reviewing its contracting processes to ensure it has improved oversight of future work assigned through third party arrangements."

MFAT appreciates the significance of both this specific set of transactions, and the wider issues raised about the export controls framework. We're treating this Air NZ process as a priority, and have urgently sought through contacts information likely to be relevant to any decision needed.

We don't see this in best case/worst case scenario from a timing perspective. Rather, the best estimate we can give is that, once we receive that requested information, maintaining the momentum is still likely to take a further two weeks from that point before a decision is made. That timeframe reflects the following components, which are probably sequential rather than simultaneous:

- ISED's technical assessment of the items against the export controls framework i.e. the technical basis for the decision(s)
- Potential engagement with Air NZ for any clarification and natural justice reasons
- Assessment by CW, LGL and Crown Law of any proposed decision against the legal framework

MFAT has taken steps to ensure that all of these components can process as quickly as possible and appropriate, for example by instructing Crown Law now so they can read into the background and law.

Air New Zealand Gas Turbines review - further update

Air New Zealand continues to progress its internal review and the independent external review being carried out by PwC on its Gas Turbines business is also well underway.

Air New Zealand Chairman Dame Therese Walsh says the airline has now received advice from the QC appointed to review the licensing requirements for exporting the specific type of engines the business was repairing for the Royal Saudi Navy.

"The legal advice we have received from Mike Heron QC is that the export of the two engines to Germany for the Royal Saudi Navy did not require an export permit under the Customs Act, nor did it require a notification to the Secretary of Foreign Affairs and Trade. The advice is that new notification requirements introduced in late 2020 do not apply to contracts entered into before September 2020 (when the notification requirement was expanded for certain military related exports). The contract for this Royal Saudi Navy work was agreed in May 2019. We are discussing this advice with MFAT.

"The independent review by external advisors PwC is well underway and they have had an interim meeting with the Board, but a final report is not expected for a few more weeks. The Board is satisfied with how the reviews are tracking and the interim measures that have been put in place. They have expressed their appreciation for the cooperation and assistance of the Gas Turbines employees involved in the reviews."

Air New Zealand Chief Executive Officer Greg Foran says the internal review is progressing well and early findings have helped the business to identify where there are opportunities to improve processes.

"We have taken immediate steps to ensure all future work of a military or government nature is escalated to Executive level for review, including ethical considerations, and approval before a contract can proceed. We will also work with relevant governmental agencies to ensure our understanding of issues for differing jurisdictions is kept up to date.

"For Air New Zealand, business is more than just revenue, we've got to make sure the work we are doing fits within our values. It's clear we've still got some work to do to make sure our processes support us to make the right decisions and we're committed to getting on and doing it."

- Air NZ Gas Turbines is seeking to bid for a contract to overhaul three US Navy General Electric (GE) LM2500 marine gas turbine engines in 2021. Should the US Navy accept the tender then Air NZ would be irrevocably bound to complete the contract.
- Air New Zealand has previously undertaken the same work for the US Navy over a number of years.
- These are the same types of engine which Air New Zealand has done work for other navies.
- Accordingly, Air NZ has sought an export permit from us in advance so as to be assured they will be able to re-export the engines.
- Air New Zealand must submit the tender by close of business on Wednesday 24 February 2021.
- Officials have undertaken an assessment of whether the engines are 'controlled items' under the Customs and Excise Act 2018, and would therefore require an export permit.
- The determination of the control status, based on the parameters listed in the New Zealand Strategic Goods List, rests on whether the engines constitute components of a warship specially designed for military use.
- In making the assessment Air New Zealand offered to provide supporting information. MFAT sought advice from the Royal New Zealand Navy (on the basis that these engines are used in our ANZAC frigates) and from the State Department's Office of Defense Trade Controls Policy.
- We have received a US State Department official determination dated 01 June 2005 which Air New Zealand has obtained from General Electric which states that LM2500 and LM2500+ engines are not subject to US export controls and that they do not have any unique military capabilities or any inherently military technologies. The determination states that the export of these engines may require authorisation from the Department of Commerce.
- We have subsequently received confirmation from the State Department that the 2005 determination still applies, and a reference to the Commerce Department controls which now apply. The applicable Commerce control is EAR 99 which pertains only to an embargoed or sanctioned country, to a party of concern, or in support of a prohibited enduse.
- We assess that the US determination made by US export controls technical specialists, with access to all the required technical specifications provided by General Electric, to be authoritative. It is based on information from the manufacturer assessed by the export controls experts of the country of origin.
- On the basis of this technical information, which has assessed the control status of the engines on the same criteria as we are required to apply, the Ministry considers that the engines would not be controlled as per the Strategic Goods List. Rather, they would be subject to our catch-all controls on the basis that they constitute the export of non-controlled goods to a military end-user.
- Although subject to catch-all controls Air New Zealand will not require an export permit
 as the engines would be consigned for use in an exempt destination (Australia, Canada,
 Iceland, Japan, Norway, South Korea, Switzerland, the United Kingdom of Great Britain
 and Northern Ireland, the United States of America or a member state of the European
 Union).

Increasingly we and ISED are getting queries from New Zealand companies who have contracts under way or who are tendering for work with Saudi Government Departments or Companies with Government links. Queries so far relate to goods or services probably not covered by the Export controls regime where companies want some guidance on where they stand with regard to reputational risk and how much scrutiny they may come under, i.e. how badly could it be perceived .

We propose to respond along the following lines – but wanted to sense check it with you.

"Thank-you for your query around exports of goods/services to Saudi Arabia

Currently the only legislative controls in place for exports to Saudi Arabia relate to the New Zealand export controls regime, which is mandated under Sections 96 and 97 of the Customs and Excise Act 2018. The Customs Act does not

control the provision of services, it only deals with the export of goods and electronic publications. If your exports are covered by the list of strategic goods or come under the catch-all controls for exports of non-controlled goods to military, para military, militia, or police entities then the export controls regime does apply. Your application will assessed under the Criteria for the Assessment of Export Applications https://www.mfat.govt.nz/en/trade/trading-weapons-and-controlled-chemicals/how-your-application-is-assessed/#criteria which will necessarily consider human rights and reputational concerns.

Where exports are not controlled, as you note it is possible for there to be reputational risks for companies. The Ministry is not able to provide an opinion on whether you should trade in these circumstances, or how much scrutiny you will come under, or what measures you should take to address this should it occur. You should seek professional advice in this regard."

Export Controls

- New Zealand's export controls regime is legislated under the Customs Act. This requires
 a permit for the export of strategic goods and technologies, both military and dual use
 (i.e. items which have both military and civil uses). Controlled items are listed in the
 New Zealand Strategic Goods List.
- Under the Customs Act the implementation of the export controls regime is delegated to the Secretary of Foreign Affairs and Trade. Permits must be approved by the Secretary, or delegated officials. There is no provision within the Customs Act for Ministers to approve export permits. However, for sensitive applications MFAT does consult the Minister of Foreign Affairs and the Prime Minster (and the Minister of Trade where relevant).
- There is no minimum financial level below which a permit to export is not required.

Air New Zealand Gas Turbine Servicing

- The General Electric LM2500 marine gas turbine engine and variants is listed by the company as a military engine and is used by 33 navies worldwide.

Potential prosecution and penalties

- If there has been a potential breach of the Customs Act it would fall to Customs to investigate the breach and or pursue prosecution.
- The penalty for a body corporate for unknowingly exporting prohibited goods is a fine not exceeding \$25,000, for an individual not exceeding \$5000.
- The penalty for knowingly exporting prohibited goods for a body corporate is a fine not exceeding \$100,000 and an amount equal to 3 times the value of the goods. For an individual, the penalty is imprisonment not exceeding six months or a fine not exceeding \$20,000.

Air New Zealand: Control and Export Status of Navy Engines

Pito matua – Key points

Background

- New Zealand's system of export controls on strategic goods (our export control regime), is designed to ensure that such trades are consistent with our wider foreign, strategic and security policy. The system is an essential element of our non-proliferation, arms control and disarmament policies, and of our commitment to being a responsible exporter.
- The export of strategic goods (firearms, military goods and technologies, and goods and technologies that can be used in the production, development or delivery of nuclear, chemical or biological weapons) is prohibited under the Customs and Excise Act 2018 unless a permit has been obtained from the Secretary of Foreign Affairs and Trade.
- Media reports initially revealed that Air NZ Gas Turbines had undertaken contracts for overhauls of Electric (GE) LM2500 marine gas turbine engines for a range of navies over a number of years. This involved the recent export of two engines belonging to the Royal Saudi Navy. Air New Zealand subsequently advised that engines and related components s6(a)
- The media reports raised questions as to whether the particular engines could be controlled goods, and if so, whether Air New Zealand should have sought a permit before exporting the engines to Saudi Arabia.
- Permits for the export of this type of engine had not been previously sought and accordingly the control status of the engines had not been established with any certainty.

MFAT's assessment of the engine's control status

- Officials have now undertaken an assessment of whether the engines are 'controlled items' under the Customs and Excise Act 2018, and would therefore require an export permit.
- The determination of the control status, based on the parameters listed in the New Zealand Strategic Goods List 2019, rested on whether the engines constituted 'components of a warship specially designed for military use'.
- In making the assessment, MFAT sought advice from the Royal New Zealand Navy (as these engines are used in our ANZAC frigates) and from the US State Department's Office of Defense Trade Controls Policy. Air New Zealand also provided useful supporting information.
- determined the engine is not a controlled item
- On the basis of the technical information obtained, MFAT officials undertook an assessment of the engine's control status in accordance with the New Zealand Strategic Goods List. Specifically, we found that these engines are not a "component therefore [of a warship] specially designed for military use", in that they do not possess any unique military capabilities or any inherent military technologies. This assessment concluded that the engines are not a controlled item.
- As the engines are not controlled, Air New Zealand has not breached the Customs and Excise Act 2018 for previous exports.

Air New Zealand: Control and Export Status of Navy Engines

- Officials have also considered the separate issue of whether these engines may be subject to our catch-all controls where the export of non-controlled goods would be to a military end-user.
- Under the catch-all control transitional implementation provisions, the various LM2500 engines and related components which are currently in country are exempt from the requirement to obtain an export permit as the contracts for their overhaul predate the entry into force of the catch-all Gazette Notice on 9 October 2020.
- Future exports of these engines to military end-users (i.e. where there is no pre-existing contract prior to 9 October 2020) would require a permit, unless consigned for use in Jet the Official Information Act an exempt destination (Australia, Canada, Iceland, Japan, Norway, South Korea, Switzerland, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the United States of America or a member state of the European Union).

Commodity Determination for General Electric (GE) LM2500 and LM25006+ Marine Gas Turbine Engines

Determination

Having applied the relevant legal tests and having regard to the facts and technical information about the engine, the determination is that engine is not a controlled item.

On the basis of the technical information obtained, which has assessed the control status of the engines on the same criteria as as per ML9.a.1. New Zealand Strategic Goods List 2019, and recognizing it to be reliable, it is assessed that the engines are not a controlled item as per the New Zealand Strategic Goods List 2019.

Specifically, these engines are not a "component therefore [of a warship] specially designed for military use", in that they do not possess any unique military capabilities or any inherent military technologies.

These engines may be subject to catch-all controls¹ where the export would be to a military end-user as defined in the Customs and Excise Act 2018 S 97(10).

Legal Basis

Controls on the export of strategic goods are implemented through the Customs Export Prohibition Order 2017 (or successive Orders), promulgated under Section 96 of the Customs and Excise Act 2018.

Controlled items may not be exported from New Zealand, including the electronic export of listed software and technology, unless an export licence or permission has been obtained from the Secretary of Foreign Affairs and Trade.

Controlled items are those listed in the New Zealand Strategic Goods List.

Catch-all Controls. The export of goods, software and technologies which are not listed in the New Zealand Strategic Goods List, but which may be intended for use relating, directly or indirectly, to an end-use related to weapons of mass destruction and their means of delivery, for use in terrorist acts, or for a military² end-use are prohibited unless a permit to export is obtained from the Secretary of Foreign Affairs and Trade. The catch-all controls are given effect through a Gazette Notice³.

Product Description

Determination Requirement
