Thank you for your email of 24 July 2025 in which you request the following under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA):

"Into which of the two IHL statuses does MFAT and confederates categorize NZ healthcare professionals? Civilian or Militarian?

This query includes both the majority who are self-employed in civilian society, as well as the minority who are employed in civilian society. If there are differences between the professions, please specifically identity the presumed status for each profession. A one word reply (i.e.: civilian or militarian) is required for each of the following healthcare professions who work in/for civil(ian/ised) society: Dentists, doctors, midwives and nurses.

If you are unable to provide a one word reply because there is, in fact, an intermediary status, please clearly declare what this status is called."

Information concerning the protections afforded to medical personnel can be found in New Zealand's Report on the Domestic Implementation of International Humanitarian Law. This report is publicly available on the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade's (the Ministry) website.
