

The best grass-fed milk in Germany

Grasmilch Brandenburg is the brainchild of Irish brothers Paul and Stephen Costello. On their farm, 60km west of Berlin, they produce 100% grass-fed milk.

Since 2014 the Costello brothers have modernized the farm and they now have over 900 New Zealand-bred dairy cows which live outside year round.

The cows are looked after by a great team of German, Irish and Polish farmers.

In November 2021 the Costello's won the Ceres Award for Sustainable Agriculture in Germany.



The best in agricultural technology

Grasmilch Brandenburg produces pasture-based milk for local consumers. On the farm the team are using New Zealand agricultural technology, including Gallagher fences and Waikato Milking Systems. The cows are bred using LIC genetics from New Zealand and are 50% Holstein and 50% Jersey. They are much smaller than a normal German cow and produce less milk, but with a lot more fat and protein. It is a deliciously healthy milk. "The benefits for us are less work. The health of the animals is 100 times better," says Kevin Kearns.

"I think there is a lot of potential here for the German farmers to set up a more New Zealand-like system but they just need the help and they need the advice on it."

The judges said:
