Your Excellency,

I refer to the signing on this date of the New Zealand – China Free Trade Agreement (“the Agreement”) and to the discussion in relation to the establishment of a reciprocal New Zealand – China Doctoral Research Scholarships Programme.

I wish to propose that:

New Zealand will fund three-year Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) scholarships for up to ten new students per annum from China to study in New Zealand.

China will fund three-year Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) scholarships for up to ten new students per annum from New Zealand to study in China.

The New Zealand – China Doctoral Research Scholarships programme will be jointly reviewed after three years. The review will be conducted under the auspices of the Joint Education Working Group established by the *Memorandum of Understanding on Cooperation in Education and Training between the Ministry of Education of the People's Republic of China and the Ministry of Education of New Zealand* of 9 December 2002.

If this proposal is acceptable to China, then I propose that this letter and your letter of confirmation in reply will constitute an arrangement between our two Governments, concluded in association with the Agreement.
